
South Fairmount in the 1920s






St. Bonaventure Church, dedicated in 1869, demolished in ~2004



Western Hills Pumping Station, built in 1937




Vitt & Stermer garage on Queen City Avenue & Van Hart

- Major infrastructure projects often require an evaluation of how historic properties will be impacted
- MSD is implementing a mitigation plan
- Plan is under review by Ohio EPA
- Mitigation progress to date:
 - Video History: Two local artists developed a video history of South Fairmount called "Lick Run Revival"
 - Moon Trees: Second generation "moon trees" were cloned and will be planted along the Greenway
 - **Heritage Trail:** MSD is designing a a Cultural Trail and Heritage Trail on the history of South Fairmount. The Heritage Trail will expand on the Cultural Trail throughout the South Fairmount community and capture stories and history important to the community. Both the Cultural and Heritage Trails will consist of interpretive signage linking to a website through QR codes.
